We are delighted to welcome all of the children to the Terrific Twos! They have all settled well and are enjoying building relationships with their new friends and their new teachers, and learning the routines and expectations of the setting.

During this half term our topic will be 'Who Am I?' We will be looking at photographs of ourselves and our friends and learning each others' names. We will discuss the different places we go to, e.g. school, home, the supermarket, and so on. We will also begin to name different the parts of our body and learn some new songs to support this, such as 'Head, Shoulders, Knees and Toes'.

We will also be learning how to use the outdoor space safely and how to use the new resources appropriately. We do go outside whatever the weather so please ensure your child has appropriate clothing for the weather, e.g. raincoats and bring in wellies. We are also fortunate enough to be having Little City Enfield coming to visit with their amazing role-play for us to engage in developing our communication and language through play.

## **Celebrating Achievements:**

In the Early Years we focus on how the children learn and the skills they use, such as exploring and investigating, making their own choices, and making links in their learning. We will be celebrating these skills and choosing two children a week to award certificates to and they will look like the example below.


#### **Top Tips for Talking:**

This half term's top tips:

- 1) Share books together interactive books with flaps or different textures are really great.
- 2) Give your child time they might need more time than you think to answer questions or follow instructions, so give them an extra few seconds to do this.
- 3) Younger children might find it difficult to tell you about their day at school. To support them, try giving choices like "did you paint a picture or play on the swings?" or ask "tell me one good thing that happened today". You could say one good thing about your day too, just to get the conversation going.
