Write your own recipes, in a ration book for the Year 6 teachers.</p> <p><i>Remember to scale up or down for the correct amounts (No waste during the war!)</i></p> <p>Or</p> <p>Research old British currency and write some World War 2 maths money problems.</p>	<p>Write a diary entry of an evacuee.</p> <p>Or</p> <p>Write a poem about the impacts of conflict on society.</p>	<p>Discuss the role of different leaders during World War 2. Who do you think was most influential? Was this in a positive or negative way?</p> <p>Or</p> <p>Talk to relatives about members of your family who were alive during World War 2. Share stories in class.</p>	<p>Create your own air raid shelter.</p> <p>Or</p> <p>Write a song which would boost morale during a time of conflict.</p> <p>Or</p> <p>Find a World War 2 recipe online and have a go at making it yourself.</p>	<p>Teach an adult about the role of women during World War 2. Decide whether the war could have been won without them.</p> <p>And</p> <p>Teach someone the importance of respect and tolerance as opposed to power and conflict.</p>	<p>Visit a cenotaph in the local area.</p> <p>Notice what is written on it? How does it make you feel?</p>	<p>Investigate how a radar works and how it helped in World War 2.</p>	<p>Listen to a speech by Winston Churchill during WW2. Make notes on why it was a good speech or why it was not.</p> <p>And</p> <p>Watch The Darkest Hour (PG) with a family member.</p>
